







Clear your plant area of weeds and make sure the soil is moist. Water soil if dry.






Gather your chosen mulch (eg. grass, fallen leaves, bark, manure, gravel).

Layer your mulch around your plant, make Sure your layer is 5cm thick and Spread evenly. Thank you very mulch! Ugh! Haha get it?








Here are times for germination and how long to wait until harvesting!



















GARDEN'S LEAST WANTEN



Bags for life

Place a tyre on a sheet of cardboard, put in a few sprouting potatoes and cover with earth.


When the plants grow high enough, add more earth and another tyre and so on, until you get a stack of tyres bursting with spuds!

HOW TO MAKE TOILET ROLL SEEDLING POTS

Fold the roll in half, then fold it in half the other way making a Square shape.




Cut your roll in half, making two rolls.



Following the fold lines cut up 3/4 of your roll. Do this four times. Repeat this on your other roll.



Fold your claps so they overlap each other. When you reach your last flap, tuck it under your first flap.




Repeat this on your other roll.






LET'S MAKE A MINI GREEN HOUSE!

Find a clear bottle to use and remove any wrappers.



With a pair of scissors cut your bottle in half.



Place your bottle half over your plant and you have made a mini greenhouse!





You can also use sandwich trays. Just fill with soil and plant your seeds inside-remember to give them plenty of space to grow!
