RESIST INEQUALITY, PRECARIETY, CAPITALISM  
NO CURE WITHOUT SECURE HOUSING -  
SQUAT THE LOT!



The Covid-19 crisis has magnified healthy housing + power inequalities.

Squatters still face bailiffs smashing down their doors - they're excluded from eviction postponement.

Council homeless hostels are too little, too late, treating homeless as an unhealthy inconvenience.

Over 226,000 residential homes sit empty (much more if including commercial buildings!)

THE GOVERNMENT  
VALUES LANDLORDS +  
PRIVATE PROPERTY  
HIGHER THAN PUBLIC  
HEALTH + OUR LIVES!

Temporary homeless shelters, benefits changes + tenant eviction postponements are a TEMPORARY FIX - they WON'T SOLVE A CRISIS THAT BEGAN LONG BEFORE THE PANDEMIC.

The real fix is to change the structures + system keeping these inequalities in place - capitalism, Tory governments, wealth inequality.

RESIST housing as a commodity. DEMAND space to stay safe.
